### *Overall Results and Story*

**Rochester Hills, MI** – Michigan Senior Olympians braved the 90° heat and competed today in their annual race on the boards at the International Velodrome at Bloomer Park. The racing consisted of three timed events, for each participant, on the 44° banking of the 200 meter track. The combined times from each event determined the winners in each age group.

First on the track for the 500 meter standing start time trial was Debbie Cavender who bested her 2009 time by almost two seconds. Bernie Clincke and Antoon Huyghe also sped to faster times on their 500 meter runs. This trio also posted faster times this year in the 200 meter and 2000 meter events.

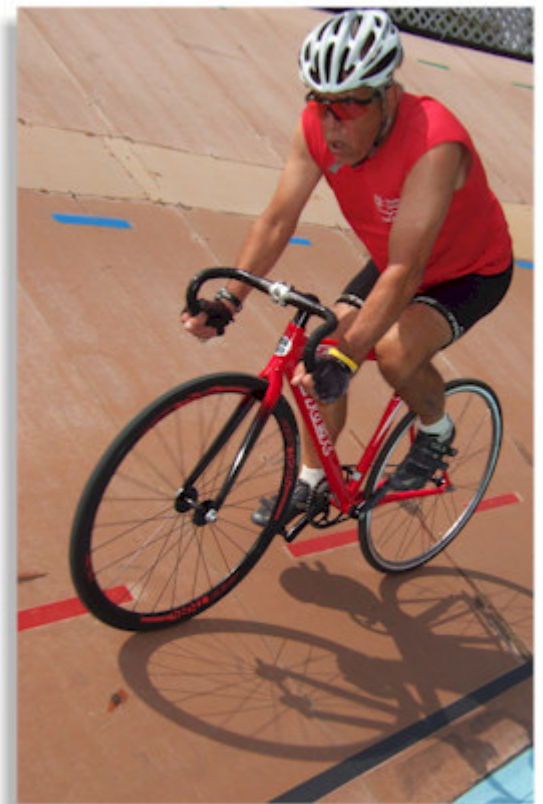

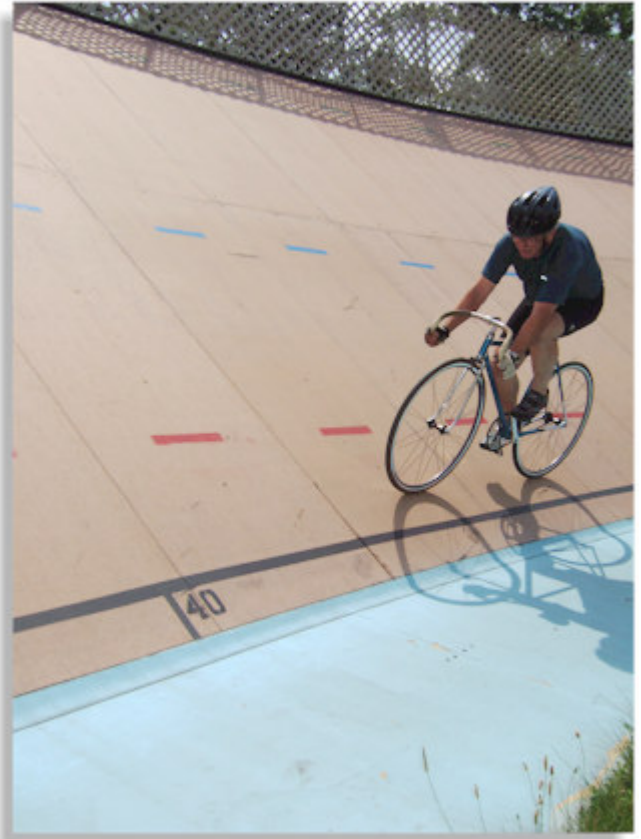
